b. Spain - Thousands of Catalans held marches in support a vote of independence for the region. However, many others held rival rallies to show unity with Spain.








b. Rocket Man - Donald Trump regularly refers to Kim Jong-Un as Rocket man which is the name of a famous song by Elton John.














The Invictus Games is a sporting event for soldiers who have been wounded or injured. Which member of the royal family has established this event?







What were the most common names for babies born in England and Wales in 2017?






What was responsible for this damage in the Caribbean at the start of the term?







China elevated the status of its president to 'lingxiu' - a reverential term for “leader”. What is the name of the Chinese president?







Which US record did One Direction equal recently?







The Paradise Papers were in the news a lot last month. What are the Paradise Papers?







A 500-year-old painting by the famous artist Leonardo da Vinci recently sold at auction and received the highest ever amount for a painting. For how many US dollars did it sell?






What has been banned by a chain of children's nurseries because of the "terrible damage" it does to the environment?


