c. The Shard - Around 15,000 lightning strikes were recorded in four hours on Saturday 26th May. Some of which struck the distinctive commercial building in London.





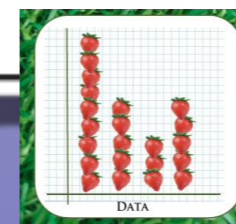
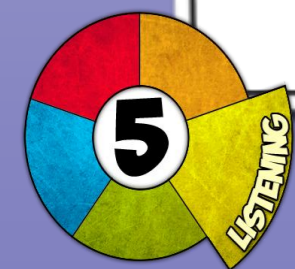

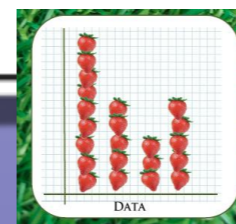
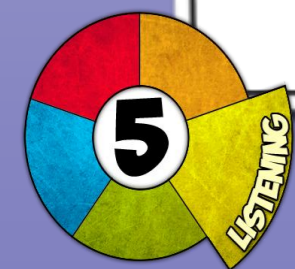




England footballer, Rajeev Sterling, has defended his choice to get a tattoo on his leg. Why has the tattoo caused controversy?

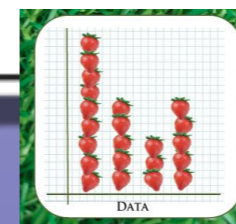
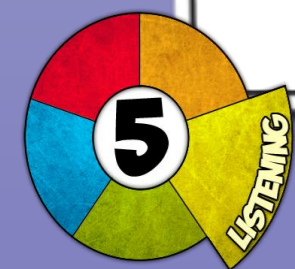




Why was Mamoudou Gassama, a migrant from Mali, awarded French citizenship last week?

Ban food manufacturers from adding sugar to cereal products - Cartoon or fictional characters, like Tony the Tiger and the Milky Bar Kid, should no longer be used to promote unhealthy food, a group of MPs says. The proposed ban would also mean that film or TV characters like superheroes could no longer appear on such foods. The recommendation was submitted with several others aimed at curbing childhood obesity.
