






The Home Office has indicated it will help commonwealth citizens that migrated here decades ago, but have struggled to prove they are in the UK legally. What name has been given to this group?


Which part of the United Kingdom marked the 20th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement this year?


What type of car is shown in this photo from earlier this year?




Why was Mamoudou Gassama, a migrant from Mali, awarded French citizenship last week?




What was the name of the performer that represented the United Kingdom in the 2018 Eurovision Song Contest?


In which country did emergency workers dealing with this situation in January?


A mission to the outer solar system came to a spectacular end when scientists deliberately crashed the Cassini space probe into which planet?

From which country are many people in the region of Catalonia seeking their independence?



b. Spain - Thousands of Catalans held marches in support a vote of independence for the region. However, many others held rival rallies to show unity with Spain.












True or false, Kim Jong Un had a face-to-face meeting with Donald Trump to discuss ending North Korea's nuclear missile programme?






What objects are piled high in this photo from earlier this year?


What claim did a Japanese astronaut mistakenly make about his recent stay on the International Space Station?

Sadly, Roger Bannister passed away during the term. For what was he well known?






This man was forced to resign as leader of his country. What is his last name?
