Individual Jack Petchey Grants For Volunteering

So, if you are planning a volunteer project abroad with World Challenge and need financial assistance with the cost, please read on!

Who can apply for a grant?

In order to apply for a grant you must:

- Live in London or Essex.
- Be aged 11 -25 at the time of your project.
- Ensure that your project involves voluntary work.
- Apply at least 3 months but not more than 9 months before the project's start date.
- Be making a financial contribution by raising at least 50% of the cost yourself. Commit to submitting a report after the project which may be used on The Jack Petchey Foundation website /in local press

What is the criteria for my volunteering project?

The project you are involved in must achieve the following objectives:

- Be of clear benefit to other young people/the wider community.
- Help raise your aspirations and achieve more out of life.
- Challenge you and increase your personal or social development.
 Volunteering must be the main focus of your project

How much can I apply for?

The Jack Petchey Foundation will fund up to £400 per person towards the total cost of the project.

They expect you to be committed to raising the balance. This links into Jack Petchey's philosophy of 50/50.
