A school was built on this site in 1931 – the main building is the original school. It was called Carshalton West Central Girls School and was described as “ a very fine building” – however there were also Boys on site...



During the war students who were not evacuated had some of their lessons in the first house next to the drive...

- In the 1930's and 40's the house's were called Balmoral, Osborne, Sandringham and Windsor
- In 1953 the school celebrated the Queen's Coronation
- In 1955 the Headteacher was diagnosed with overstrain and overwork
- In 1964 – the boys moved out
- The girls from Winchcombe School joined Carshalton West County Secondary School Girls Dept.
- In the log book it says *“Carshalton West School as it has been known for the past twenty years ceases to exist.”*
- The school was renamed – Carshalton County Secondary Girls' School



- Sometime between 1964 and 1973 the school changed its name again and became Carshalton High School for Girls
- The house's in the 70's and 80's were called Canterbury, Coventry, Winchester and Wells
- In 1990 they started building the school hall

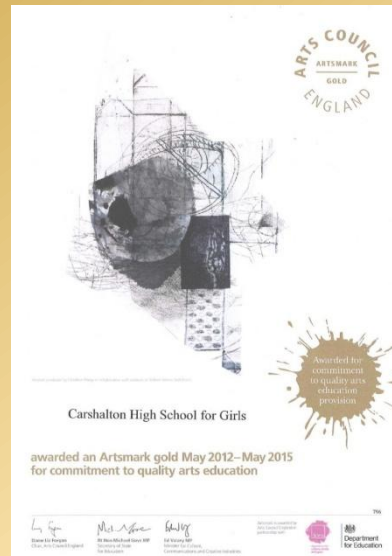
