c. Mohamed Salah, Liverpool - The Egyptian international has scored 31 goals in 33 Premier League games for Liverpool and leads the race for the golden boot.





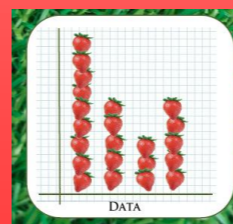
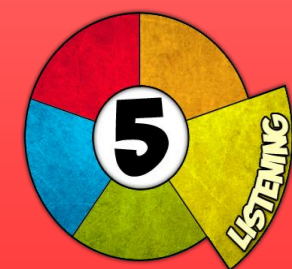
