


What type of weather event has been causing major disruption to people on the Japanese island of Kyushu?







It struck at the shallow depth of 0.9km (0.6 miles) and its epicentre was near the city of Ridgecrest, about 240km north-east of Los Angeles. A 6.4-magnitude quake hit the same area just a few days earlier.














Which two colours are used in the current Wimbledon logo?






What event were these people in Chile watching last week?




# Which entertainer is paid the most by the BBC? a. Gary Lineker b. Claudia Winkleman c. Graham Norton






True or false, Andy and Jamie Murray have another brother called Duncan


This new Slovenian statue has been in the news recently. Who is the statue based on?


