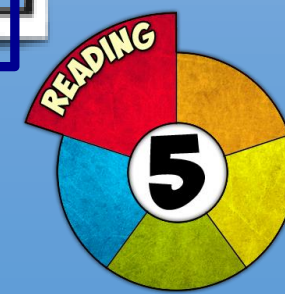
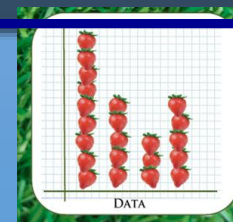
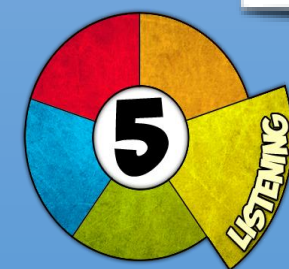


In which year did the Berlin Wall come down?

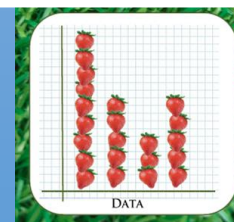
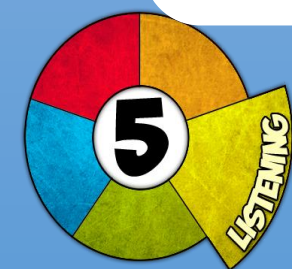


How many letters does the longest German word have?

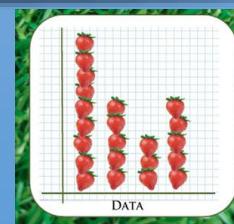
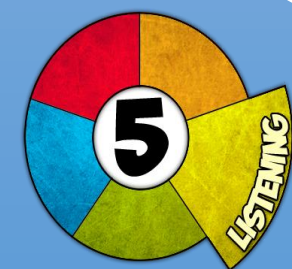


A beautifully decorated Christmas Tree is set up in Trafalgar Square every year...It is a gift from ...

In London, near the statue of Lord Nelson in Trafalgar Square, a giant Christmas tree is set up and decorated with great ceremony each year. The tree is **a thank you gift from the people of Oslo, Norway**. During the Second World War, King Haakon of Norway was forced into exile in England when the Germans occupied his country. Since 1947, Norway has expressed its thanks for the help of the British people by continuing to send a huge Norwegian spruce to be shared by all.

Prince Albert, Queen Victoria's husband , is usually credited with having introduced the Christmas tree into England in 1840. However, the honour of establishing this tradition in the United Kingdom rightfully belongs to 'good **Queen Charlotte**', the **German wife of George III**, who set up the first known English tree at Queen's Lodge, Windsor, in December, 1800.
