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
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Key messages

- Do not send your daughter to school if she is unwell or has C-19 symptoms. Lateral Flow Device (LFD) tests are for <u>asymptomatic students only</u>. If your daughter has symptoms or feels unwell, please book a test using the GOV.UK website https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test
- All students will be asked to declare that they do not have symptoms those with symptoms will not be tested and sent home. **Do not send your daughter in for confirmation of Covid-19.**
- Students will return to lessons as normal the day after testing (with the exception of Year 7) if they have a negative result. Where consent has not been given, students will return the day after their year groups testing day.
- A negative LFD test result does not mean other control measures can be broken students must continue to wash/sanitise their hands regularly.



Have you notified us of whether consent to test has been given?

- All students along with their parent/carers should have completed the student consent form by 4pm on Friday 20th August if they wish their daughter to be tested in school. Y12 and 13 will be asked to give their consent.
- Testing remains voluntary. Even if you do not consent to the test, we need you to complete the survey to confirm this choice. No student will be tested without consent and a test will be refused should any student arrive to school on testing days who does not have consent.
- Students can withdraw consent regardless of the wishes of their parents/carers.



How will the Rapid Testing work at CHSG?

- Rapid testing using Lateral Flow Device Testing will take place in our Main Hall.
- Students will undertake the test themselves and they will be guided by one of our members of staff. Please see the diagram on page 10 on how to administer the test.
- The school has the capacity to test 3 year groups per day. We are required to provide 2 in school lateral flow tests for each student.




How will the Rapid Testing work at CHSG?

- Once students have had their first test and it is negative, then they will return to school the next day ie students will go home after their test.
- For those who do not wish to be tested, they will return to school alongside their peers who were tested the day before.
- Only students who are being tested should arrive at school during the testing day for their year group. Students without consent should remain at home.
- Please make sure you check the guidance on Page 3 regarding the curriculum for each year group.

How will the Rapid Testing work at CHSG?

- Work will be set by tutors during the tutor period for students in Yr 8,9 and 10 who are at home on Monday 6th September. This work will cover both Monday and Tuesday taking into account their testing schedule.
- The result of the test will be e-mailed to the email address we hold for parents/carers. Students will not be sent the result to their e-mail address except for Y12 & 13.



After the 2nd test in school, students will be provided with home test kits for regular testing (twice a week). More guidance will be given nearer the time. The guidance states that this will be reviewed at the end of September.

Testing – what to expect for students

Students will be greeted at the gate by a member of staff

 Social distance – 2m cones will be in place for each student

Students will then proceed to a welcome desk where they will be met by a member of staff. Here they will collect an NHS card with a barcode

- Students will declare they have no symptoms
- Students will be asked to sanitize hands and blow their nose before they enter the Main Hall
- Students will be guided towards a booth where a member of staff will be waiting to assist them.
- ▶ 1st test students will return home immediately after the test.
- 2nd students will return to lessons.



Testing – what to expect for parents/carers

- Once you have given consent we will upload the necessary data into the NHS portal.
- The result from the test will then be uploaded to the same NHS Track and Trace portal
- The NHS barcode will link your daughter's result to the contact details we have registered here at CHSG
- You will then receive an email from NHS Track and Trace confirming the result.
- It is important that we have the most up to date email address for you

Your coronavirus lateral flow test result is negative. It's likely you were not infectious when the test was done.

Keep following coronavirus advice including:

- regular handwashing
- social distancing
- · wearing a face covering where recommended

You only need to self-isolate if:

- you get symptoms of coronavirus you'll need to book a different test at https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test
- someone you live with tests positive, or has symptoms and has not been tested yet
- you've been traced as a contact of someone who tested positive

What happens if my child tests positive during Test 1?


- Students will be returning home after their 1st test. The result from Track and Trace will be sent to you via e-mail.
- Your daughter will have to isolate and take a PCR test within 2 days of the LFD test. If the PCR is negative, she can return to School providing she has no symptoms.
- If there is no PCR test or it is longer than 2 days she will need to isolate for the full 10 days.
- Close contacts will only isolate if they have been identified by Test and Trace. Close contacts will be advised to take a PCR test. Schools will no longer be Test and Trace.
- Online lessons will be provided by your daughter's teachers.



What happens if my child tests positive during Test 2?

- The result from Track and Trace will be sent to you via e-mail.
- We will accompany your daughter to a waiting room where we will ask your daughter to contact you.
- Sovernment guidelines asks that a parent/carer should collect their child from school immediately. If a parent/carer is unable to do so then they can give permission for their daughter to make her own way home. The guidance states that your daughter should not use public transport.
- Students can be collected from the front of the school outside the pedestrian gate area.
- Please ask for your daughter at reception when you arrive and we will then escort her to you.
- You should follow the same guidance as Test 1 ie isolate and PCR test.






Testing whilst learning in school

- Students will attend school and lessons as normal with the usual timings.
- Students will leave their lesson at their allocated times (TBC) and make their way to the hall. They should take their coat and bag with them. They will be advised where to line up outside the Main Hall.
- Once tested they will wait in the school plaza or gym for 30mins.
- Once their test is confirmed as negative, they can return to lessons.
- In the event that a student tests positive, we will follow the steps outlined in slide 19 and start the Track and Trace process.
- Students without consent or who are testing at home will remain in lessons.






Home testing

- Testing at home remains important in reducing the risk of transmission within Schools.
- Government guidance remains that the first LFD tests should be undertaken at school with subsequent testing happening at home twice per week (Sunday & Wednesday). This will be reviewed in September.
- We will supply students who opt in with testing kits after their 2nd LFD test. We ask that all results are uploaded onto Test Register (Guidance and reminders on how to do so will be sent out in September)







Do students have to wear face masks?

- The most recent guidance staes that face coverings will no longer be required for pupils, staff and visitors either in classroom or in communal areas.
- We will return to masks if there is an outbreak, as part of our outbreak management plan
- Students will be reminded to maintain hand and respiratory hygiene.
- We will continue with a rigorous cleaning regime and ensure rooms are ventilated fully with windows and doors remaining open
