


Year 7 Exam Information Booklet





INFORMATION:

The exam questions will be based on 'The Giver'.

How does Lowry present Jonas's understanding of himself and others so far in the novel?

What skills will I be tested on?

READING: You will need to write up your ideas about the book in clear, easy-to-follow paragraphs.

WHAT: Present your thoughts about the passage at the beginning of each paragraph as <u>clear</u>, <u>relevant</u> <u>claims</u>

e.g. Auggie sometimes appears a confident child, despite his difficulties.

HOW: Add evidence to support your claim, using quotation marks

e.g. He corrects Julian, '"The word's 'supposedly', by the way", I said.'


WHY: <u>Analyse</u> how the writer writes in the example of evidence.

e.g. Here, Palacio uses dialogue and speech to show that although Auggie has not had many conversations with peers in his life, he confronts Julian's meanness by correcting him and showing him that he can stand up for himself. The phrase 'by the way' suggests slight sarcasm, revealing that Auggie is secure in his academic ability, even though he may be anxious about his looks

What skills will I be tested on?


Number, Algebra, Geometry, Statistics and Probability will be tested.

What topics will I need to revise?



The exam will last for 50 minutes.

There will be five sections in the exam paper as follows:

- In Section 1, students will be tested on key words and people.
- In Section 2, students will answer a series of short questions to test their knowledge and understanding. Some of the questions will be multiple choice.
- In Section 3, students will read and answer questions about a historical source.
- In Section 4, students will read and answer questions about a historical interpretation.
- In Section 5, students will wite a paragraph to explain a historical event or change

What topics will I need to revise?

You need to revise the following topics, using your workbooks from class:

- 1. Sanitation and health in Britain, c.700BC 1900AD
- 2. Why did William win at Hastings in 1066AD?
- 3. How did the Normans establish control in England?
- 4. What made the Church so important to people in medieval England?

What skills will I be tested on?

You will be tested on the following skills:


- Your recall of key people, events and changes.
- Your knowledge and understanding of how and why changes happen.
- Your ability to make your own conclusions from a historical source.
- Your ability to compare two interpretations.
- Your ability to explain a historical event or change in an extended paragraph.

The exam will be in the format of a booklet for the students to write their answers in.

The exam will take approximately 45 minutes to complete.

There will be a mixture of question styles- including short-response (tick the correct box or complete the missing word), and some longer-response questions (explaining processes or features).

What skills will I be tested on?

It is a reading test that covers topics and vocabulary of workbooks 2 and 3.

There will be a range of questions testing the ability to understand and respond to texts with activities like ticking boxes, multiple choice, short answers in English or in the target language. Also, a short translation into English.

What topics will I need to revise?

You need to know all that your teacher has taught in your workbooks for Units 2 and 3.

What skills will I be tested on?

This is your reading test. Earlier in the year you have done a Listening test. This test checks a very important skill that is your ability to understand and respond to texts in the language you are studying.

- Exam will take place on the computer with mixture of multiple choice and written answers


What topics will I need to revise?

- E-Safety (Safety on Social Networking, Cyber Bulling, Dangers to Computers Virus, Spams, Phishing, Scams and Schemes)
- Scratch (Scratch creating code using various blocks and interpreting and analysing codes)
- Al Artificial Intelligence (Uses Al, The Origin of Al, Rules and Facts in Al, Machine Learning, Categorising Data)

What skills will I be tested on?

- Knowledge and understanding of Computer Science Keywords

- The exam will last 40 minutes.
- There will be 3 sections to the exams each focused on a different Citizenship skill.
- Sections 1 and 2 will be short questions focusing on knowledge and understanding.
- The 3rd section will require students to give their own opinion on an issue supported by reasoned and sustained knowledge and understanding.


What topics will I need to revise?

What topics will I need to revise?



Tempo: Adagio – slow, Allegro – fast, accelerando -gradually getting faster, rallentando – gradually getting slower

Show and apply knowledge of materials and embellishment


The ability to draw accurately without a ruler and render surfaces with different levels of tone depending on the light source

The ability to multiply and price the required amount of materials needed when increasing the number of products to be made.
