



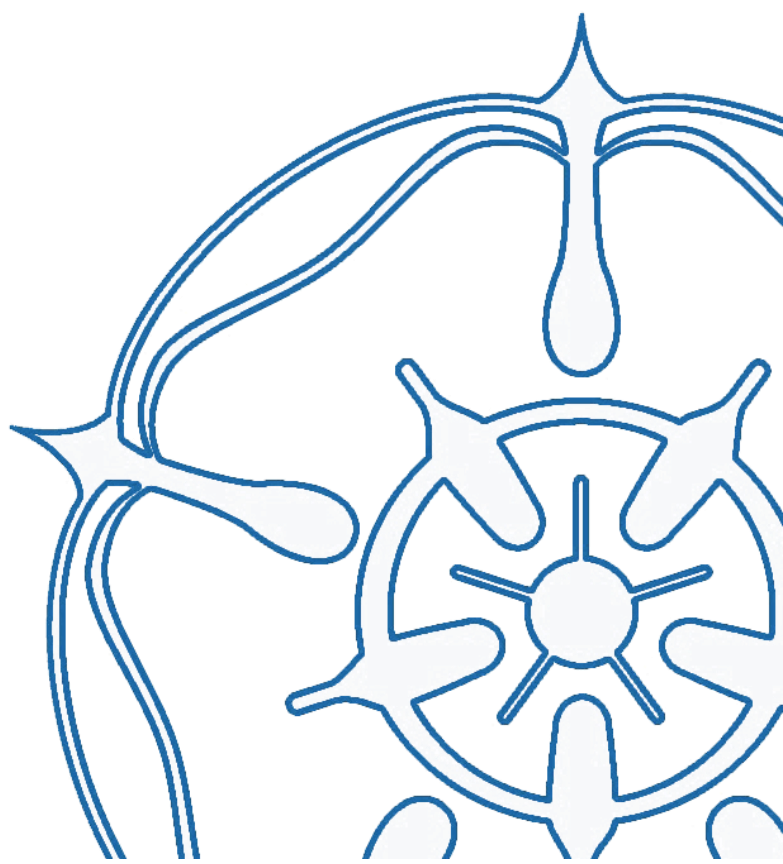

What will the exam look like?

40 minutes, 40 marks (multiple choice questions, short response, and one longer (4 mark response)).

What will I be tested on?

Knowledge and understanding of the concepts in:

- Body Systems

What will the exam look like?

40 minutes, 40 marks (multiple choice questions, short response, and one longer (4 mark response)).

What will I be tested on?

Knowledge and understanding of the concepts in:

- Elements
- Types of Reaction

What will the exam look like?

A range of multiple choice and short answer questions.

What skills will I be tested on?

Content will cover information learnt in booklets:

- What is Citizenship?
- What are our identities and communities?
- Local Democracy (only content covered prior to exam)

Computer Science

What will the exam look like?

Online exam with a mixture of multiple choice and short answered questions.

What will I be tested on?

Unit 7.1 E-Safety and Unit 7.2 Computational Thinking.

Dance

There will be no exam for Dance.

Design and Technology

What will the exam look like?

There will be a mixture of question types, including multiple choice and short answer questions.

What will I be tested on?

The exam will be based on the knowledge of the tools and machinery used in the workshop and health and safety within the workshop. You will also be tested on your knowledge of Timbers, Polymers and Electronics.

Drama

What will the exam look like? It will be a written exam.

What will I be tested on?

This will include short answer questions such as multiple-choice questions that will test you on all the knowledge you have gained in Year 7 so far. You will also be asked to consider how you would use design elements for a given extract.

English

What will the exam look like?

- Part A. Short answer questions testing knowledge of Poetry (10 marks)
- Part B. A mini-essay on Childhood Poetry (2 paragraphs – 30 marks)

40 minutes

Total: 40 marks

What will I be tested on?

- Knowledge of Poetry (key terms and definitions)
- Your understanding of ideas about childhood and poet's methods from reading a poem of your choice from the Childhood poetry collection.

Food

What will the exam look like?

There will be a mixture of question types, including multiple choice and short answer questions.

What will I be tested on?

The exam will be based on your knowledge of health and safety in the kitchen, the Eatwell guide and the importance of a healthy diet for different age ranges. You will also be expected to know about the role of the Environmental Health Officer and the 14 main allergens.

French

What will the exam look like?

It is a listening, reading and writing test that covers topics and vocabulary of workbook 1 and 2. Similar to the exam in Term 1.

The listening part includes a dictation. Spellings are very important.

In the writing part you must cover all bullet points and grammar is very important. It also includes a translation into French.

The listening and reading parts combined make 50% of the mark.

The writing part makes the other 50% of the final mark.

What will I be tested on?

- AO1: Understanding and responding to different types of spoken language.
- AO3: Understanding and responding to different types of written language.
- AO4: Communicating effectively in writing for a variety of purposes.

Geography

What will the exam look like?

Types of Questions: multiple choice, one word or one sentence answers. Short paragraphs.

What will I be tested on?

- Big Ideas: 1-Use geographical knowledge; 2-Show geographical understanding; 4-Use geographical skills
- My World Map Skills, Weather & Climate, Urbanisation Key words

History

What will the exam look like?

- For question 1, you need to match ten keywords to the correct definitions.
- For question 2, you need to answer some short quiz questions
- For question 3, you need to read two extracts written by historians and explain the main difference between them.
- For question 4, you need to explain the causes of an event.

What will I be tested on?

- Unit 1: How has London changed over time?
- Unit 2: How did the Normans take control of England after 1066CE?
- Unit 3: Who were the Crusaders?

Maths

What will the exam look like?

A 40 minute paper that looks just like your unit assessments.

What will I be tested on?

Everything covered so far in Year 7.

Music

What will the exam look like?

A short practical music exam which will take place in Lesson 4 of the Music of Asia scheme of work. You will perform a short piece of music that you have written in lessons on the keyboard. You will be performing with a partner. Please note this assessment will likely take place before Year 7 assessment week, whenever your class gets to Lesson 4 in the booklet. Speak to your teacher to confirm the date.

What will I be tested on?

Your Keyboard skills (playing the correct notes and performing fluently and confidently). You will get marks for how creative your performance is and how many different notes you use, as well as for how well-structured your piece is.

Religious Studies

What will the exam look like?

Your exam will be divided into three sections:

- **Section 1:** 10 key word definitions (these will be a selection of key words taken from the knowledge organisers of Unit 1: Intro to belief; Unit 2: Code breaking and Unit 3: What do people believe about God?) – this will be worth 10 marks.
- **Section 2:** An explanation question (5 marks) about religious symbols taken from Unit 2: 'Code breaking'
- **Section 3:** An evaluation question (5 marks) taken from Unit 3: 'What do people believe about God?'



What will I be tested on?

- You will need to know the meanings of the keywords covered in booklets 1-3, although you will not be tested on spellings.
- You need to know the meaning of some religious symbols from religions such as Christianity, Islam and Hinduism.
- You need to know a selection of reasons why some people do believe in God and some people do not believe in God.

Spanish

What will the exam look like?

Visual Arts

What will the exam look like?

You will need to complete a still life or landscape painting in the style of a chosen artist. You will also need to answer few questions about chosen artist/ art movement.

What will I be tested on?

Colour mixing, compositions, shape/form, links to the artists' style and knowledge of an artist/art movement work.
