Last Wednesday student council held our first meeting, covering a wide range of topics such as improving student's behaviour in lessons, Covid protocols, canteen food, house names and other general inquires. We discussed the Covid protocols in depth to allow the school to keep students, teachers and parents/guardians safe. We were very impressed with lots of aspects, such as the way the school enforces the government guidelines and the fact that the school provides students with free, practical hand sanitizer bottles and stations. However we raised some concerns in the meetings about the lack of social distancing in the classrooms or the crowding in corridors and offered solutions such as letting students out of lessons at staggered times to avoid crowds. These concerns and solutions will now be raised again in SLT meetings to put these ideas into action.

We then fed back these ideas directly to our forms. We will also present them to student voice that will deliver them to their forms. We gained lots of ideas and constructive criticisms to put forward in our next meeting, and the whole experience was very effective. We had ideas about changing the cartons of water to bottles, using a card or other non – contact ways to pay for food, investing in taking students temperature to check for symptoms and wearing leggings as well as joggers as part of your PE kit for convenience. These ideas are only from one form so far, so we will have many ideas for the next meeting.

Over all the experience was very positive and gave us a sense of value at the school. We look forward to the next meeting.

Plastic studs and plasters are not permissible.


