Following the early and unfortunate death of Sarah Everard, Carshalton High School for Girls decided to pay tribute and show their respects. As an all-girls school successful and historic woman are forever being displayed to encourage and inspire your daughters. Whilst their struggle is recognised, we stop only to focus on what they achieve and how. As we shape girls into young women it has become more apparent that a new lesson and appreciation must be discussed.

Sarah Everard was simply a woman who was walking home on her way home from her friend's house. Like many other women she had faith that she would make it home safely; sadly, she did not. The same week she went missing and her remains were found, coincided with international women's day and Mother's Day. The week was about uplifting and honouring women nationally, but for some it was a week full of unpleasant events.
