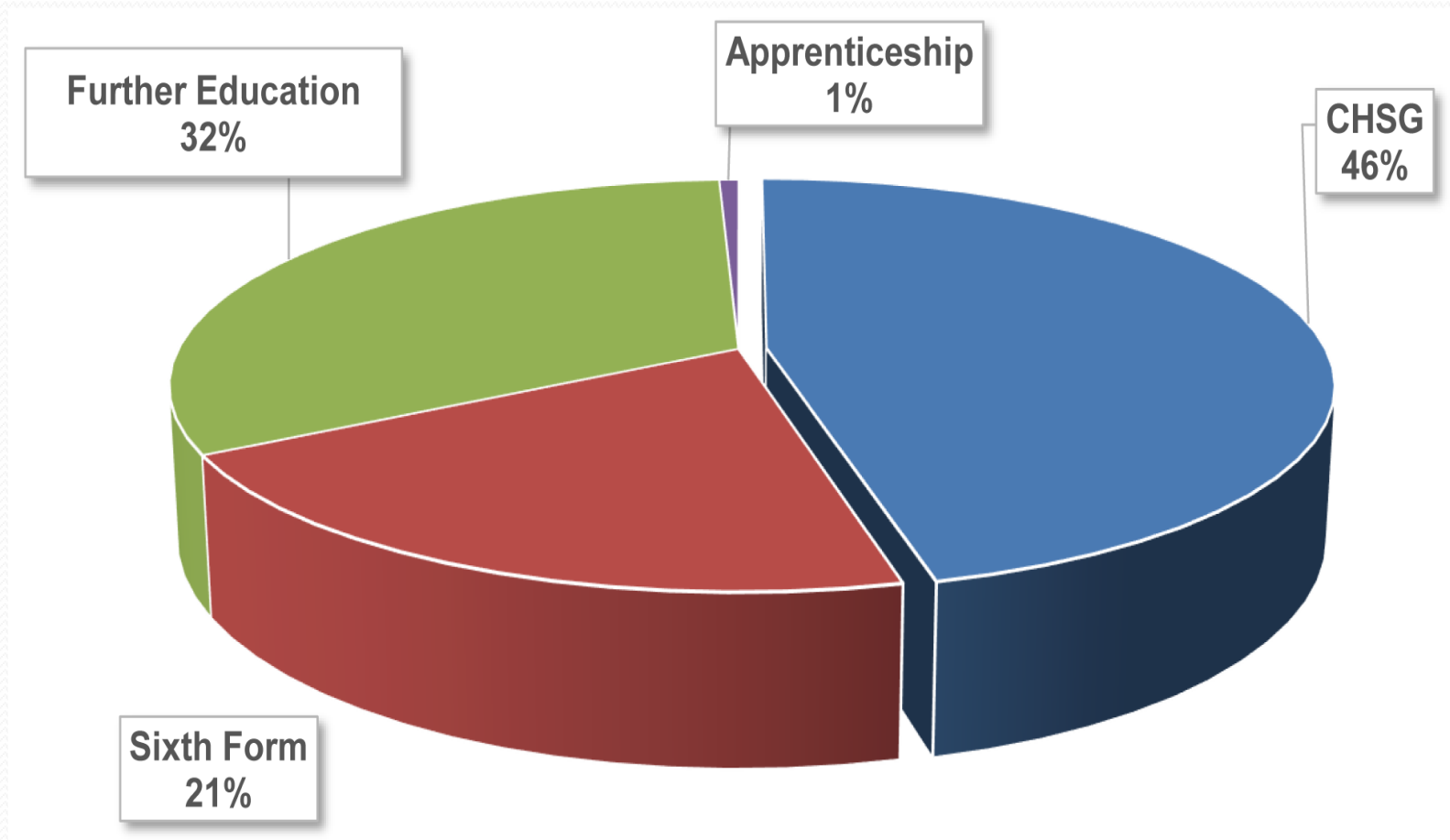

BTECs are taught in vocational subjects such as Business, Construction, Engineering, Health & Social Care, Hospitality, Travel & Tourism and Sport.

Did you know?

A levels are the most popular qualification for 16 to 19 year olds in the UK, but they are not right for everyone, make sure you know what they involve and that they will work for you.

- Where are they now?
(What qualifications, skills, interests, etc. do they have?)
- Where do they want to get to?
- How will they get there?
- Look ahead. Does the course lead to a job or is more training needed?
- What qualifications do you need to get on the course?
- Would your daughter enjoy the topics or subjects?

Subject A Level	Minimum entry requirements
Art & Design: Fine Art Photography	6 in Art 6 in Art, Photography or Media
Biology, Chemistry & Physics	6 in Combined Science or 6 or related Science and 6 in Maths and English
Business	5 in English Language and 5 in Maths and three other 5+ subjects
Computer Science	6 in ICT or a grade 6 in Computer Science
Dance	6 in Dance and a 5 in English Language
Drama	5 in Drama and a 4 in English Language
English	6 in both English Literature & English Language and five 5+ other grades
Film Studies	5 in English Language and/or a 5 in GCSE Media Studies if taken
MFL	5
Geography	6 in Geography, 5 in English Language and a 5 in Maths
History	6 in History and either a 6 in English Language or Literature
Law	5 in English Language and a 5 in a Humanities subjects
Maths	High 6 in Maths
Media	5 in English Language and/or a 5 in GCSE Media Studies if taken
Music	5 in Music and/or a grade V in ABRSM theory
PE	6 in PE and a 5 in English and a 5 in Combined Science or Biology
Politics or Sociology	5 in English Language and strong grades in five other subjects
Psychology	5 in Combined Science, 4 in Maths and 5 English



Subject Vocational	Minimum entry requirements
Applied Science AQA Level 3	5 in Combined Science and 5 in Maths and English
Business BTEC Level 3	4 in English Language
Dance BTEC Level 3	6 in Dance, 5 in English Language
Health and Social Care BTEC Level 3	4 in English Language
Sport (BTEC) BTEC Level 3	4 in PE and a 4 in English and a 4 in Combined Science
Travel and Tourism BTEC Level 3	4 in English Language

Where are they going to do it?

Question

- How many Colleges or 6th form can you apply to?

School 6th form or college

- Get prospectus or look online
- Find out what grades are needed
- Attend the school or college open evenings
- Listen to advice as long as it is impartial and up-to-date.
- Consider transport needs and travel times.
- Check **Ofsted**. This will give you an idea of how good the school or college actually is.
- Ask about the level of care and pastoral support.
- Check out the leisure and social activities on offer.
- Confirm the length of day, the number of days per week and how long the course lasts. Unlike school, courses will not be full-time (five days a week).
- Discuss the course with students (and their parents) who are currently attending the college or sixth form.
- Ask about the school or college's success rate.
- Check the 'dropout' rates for students, as this can indicate the quality of the course.
