

Sixth Form Dress Code 2021

Students must be smartly dressed at all times, as you would be if working in a smart professional environment. Sixth Form students are role models for the rest of CHSG and as such need to be smartly presented at all times. A smart business style is therefore expected.

Clothing must be smart professional attire and not casual wear.

All students **must** wear their ID badges at all time.

The school values the diversity of cultures, religions and disabilities of its staff and will take a sensitive approach when this affects dress requirements, however, faces must remain uncovered in school.

The following may be helpful to clarify what is and is not appropriate:

- No denim
- No revealing clothes (e.g. low/see through tops, tight/short skirts)
- No sports t-shirts/shorts (except PE & Dance students)
- No inappropriate footwear e.g. flip flops, sandals and trainers (except PE and Dance students)
- Tops may be sleeveless but should not have spaghetti straps
- Any cropped trousers/culottes must be formal and tailored
- Leggings are **not** acceptable when worn as trousers
- Trousers should be tailored
- No gloves, hats, caps and bandannas
- No overly conspicuous jewellery - large earrings, necklaces
- Tattoos should not be visible. Visible body piercing is restricted to the ears and/or one small nose stud only. Bars, scaffolds and stretchers are not permitted.

Students will be sent home if they do not conform to the Dress Code. Parents/Carers will be contacted on the first occasion a student is required to be sent home in relation to a dress code violation. In the event of any subsequent digression from the dress code, the student will be issued with a detention and sent home to change, but no contact will be made with the Parent/Carer.

If you fail to comply with these guidelines you will be dealt with in line with the School Discipline Structure.
