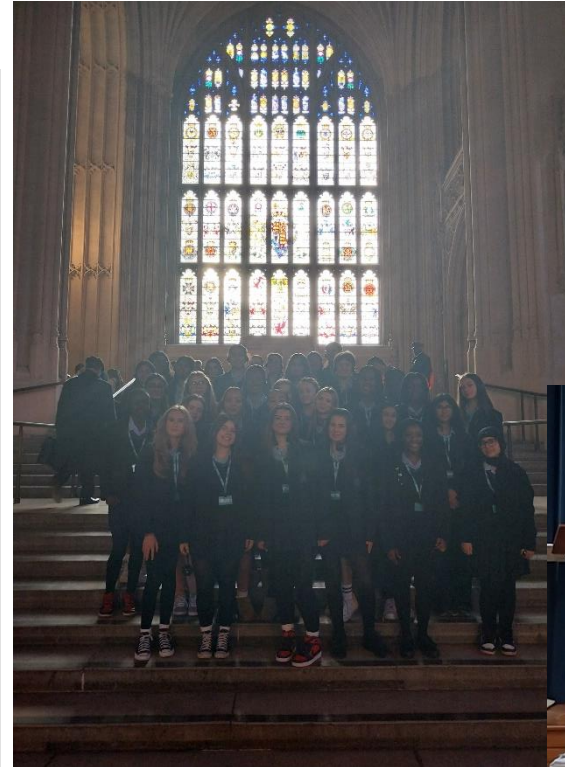

'Trans' means a person whose gender identity is not the same as the sex they were assigned at birth

It include non-binary people who do not fall into the categories of male/female.

Being transgender does not imply any specific sexual orientation. A trans person can be gay, straight, bisexual, lesbian or any other sexual orientation.

Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) on November 20. On this day, victims of transphobic violence are commemorated.

"Above all, remember that everyone, from all walks of life no matter how they choose to identify themselves, is worthy of respect. Even if you don't yet have a full understanding about what it means to be trans."
