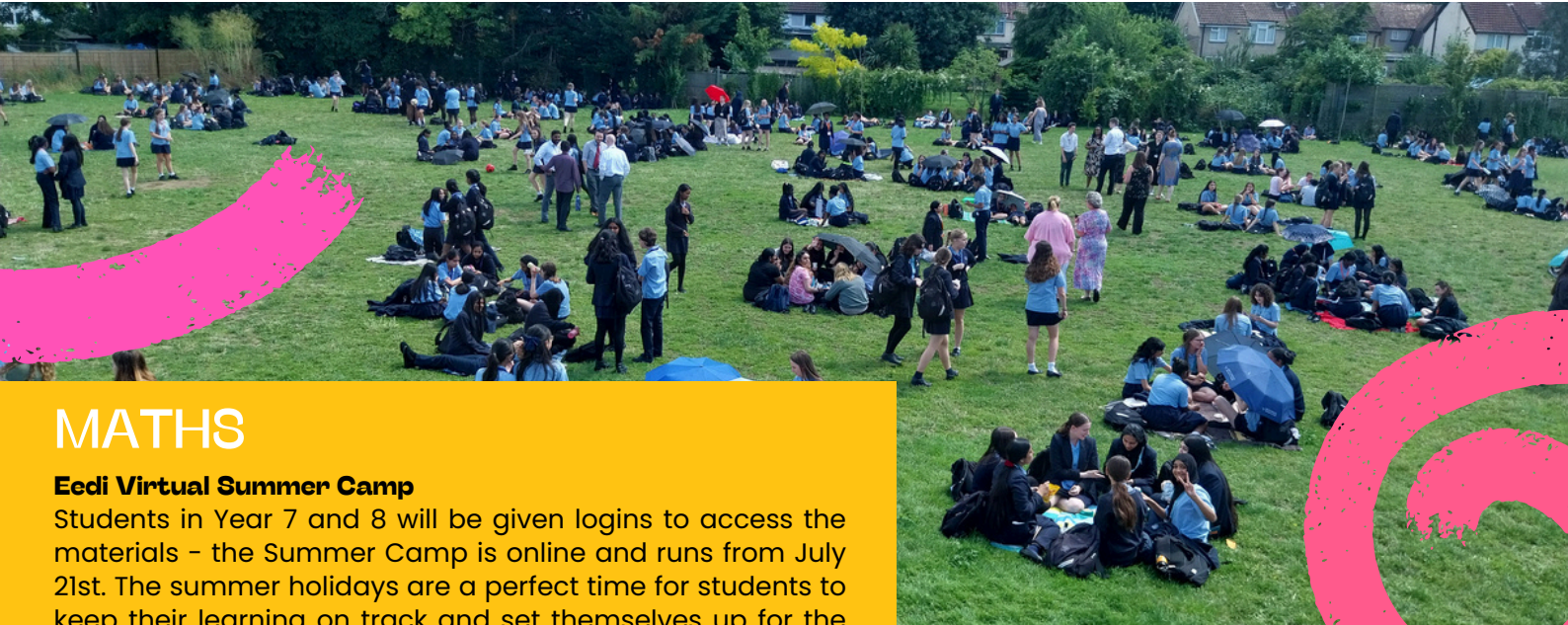




SUMMER ACTIVITIES GUIDE

To help parents keep children engaged, active, and learning over the summer, we've put together a Summer Activities Guide that includes fun, low-cost, and educational activities that align with subject areas and can be easily done at home or outdoors



MATHS

Eedi Virtual Summer Camp

Students in Year 7 and 8 will be given logins to access the materials - the Summer Camp is online and runs from July 21st. The summer holidays are a perfect time for students to keep their learning on track and set themselves up for the new school year.

- By participating in this club, students will:
- Stay engaged with learning and avoid the summer slide
- Bust misconceptions and build confidence in their skills
- Prepare academically for the upcoming year with continuous maths practice

Throughout the summer holidays, we'll be putting a Question of the Day (QOTD) in every student account. By completing the QOTD each day, students will earn one entry into the weekly prize draw. Every week, we'll give away a special prize to 3 lucky students!

From the first day of summer club, students will find their Question of the Day within their account. Here's how they can access it:

1. Go to the "Topics" tab in the top navigation.
2. Scroll right to the bottom of this tab, and they'll see the QOTD.
3. All they need to do is complete the QOTD once a day, and they'll earn an entry into the weekly prize draw!

ART

The Southbank centre runs a number of art related workshops for children which are free. These can be booked via the link. The Royal Academy of Art also run art workshops for children. These can be booked via the link. In addition many of London's most popular galleries permanent collections are free to visit, these include Tate Britain, Tate Modern, The National Gallery, The V&A and Serpentine Gallery.

MUSIC

BBC Proms has under 18s tickets from £5 and standing tickets from £7; Horniman museum musical instruments exhibition is free.

GEOGRAPHY

Get outdoors and view nature in it's splendor. London is a green city and has many free parks. For paid places of interest, why not visit the [WWT in Barnes](#)? For museums the Science and Natural History museums along with the Royal Observatory Greenwich are great places to visit.

HISTORY

Visit the following sites for free:

You could also visit and climb the [Monument](#) (built to commemorate the Great Fire of London) - child tickets are £3 and adult £6.



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CITIZENSHIP

Visit the UK Parliament (London); Take a free guided or self-guided tour of the Houses of Parliament to see democracy in action and learn about how laws are made.

Royal Courts of Justice; Take a free guided tour of the UK's highest civil court to learn about the legal system and the rule of law in action.

Migration Museum; Explore exhibitions that delve into the stories of migration and its impact on British society, fostering discussions on identity and diversity.

BFI Mediatheque; Access a vast archive of British film and television, including documentaries and programmes that explore social issues and civic life.

Museum of London; Explore London's history, including its governance and the development of civil society, through engaging exhibits.

DT AND TEXTILES

Visiting the Victoria and Albert Museum is free and right up the street from the Natural History Museum and Science Museum in London.

You could take a look at the costume, fashion, design and jewellery exhibitions before embarking on your own jewellery design project. Step into the shoes of Tatty Devine and design your own jewellery using the guide provided.

Sociology

Black Cultural Archives (Y11/Sixth Form) - Museum dedicated to Black cultural history in South London / Brixton and they do a variety of events,

Museum of the Home (Y9-13) - they do various exhibitions looking at the home, family and links to biodiversity and the environment,

Karl Marx - Walking Tour (Y9-13) - walking tour of Karl Marx life,

Welcome Collection Exhibition (Y11- Sixth Form form) - they do various exhibitions - current one is on Covid and impact on society/ culture /

Crown Court Old Bailey (Sixth Form) - for free you can watch a live court case. You can check ahead of time what cases will be shown and go to view a real-life case
