

## CHSG Careers Programme overview 2022/23

<b>Year 7</b>	Students commence fortnightly career lessons as part of the tutor time programme to include recording achievements, changes in the world of work and introducing Labour Market Information.	Careers Morning is an opportunity for students to be introduced to the CHSG careers programme and enrol on our Unifrog platform. As part of the careers morning they will have a visit from a local college and Virtual talks from employers- this is my careers and this is what I do.	Students will start think about the range of Careers and the skills needed for certain job roles. All students are invited to Kidzania a mini city for children that develops their knowledge of careers for the future.
<b>Year 8</b>	As students head towards their GCSE Options they will take part in an options workshop delivered by Merton College.	Students will have a Careers Induction as part of Careers day. They will think about how to make decisions. Looking at Labour market Information and use Unifrog to complete some careers research. They will have a GCSE Options evening.	Continuing with fortnightly career lessons to include the differences between school and work, how to make decisions, budgeting and what qualifications mean.
<b>Year 9</b>	Students continue with fortnightly career lessons, exploring qualifications, choosing jobs, taking a closer look at post 16 options.	Students have various employer and university visits. South Thames Group College assembly to talk about vocational learning.	Students start to think about Work experience, using Unifrog and the second of their Careers days to explore the options available to them. They are encouraged to use Barclays life skills.
<b>Year 10</b>	Students continue to look and prepare for work experience, assistance is given to students that are struggling to find placements. Additional sessions to cover thinking about behaviour and Health & Safety in the workplace.	Visits to include a local college, and a university to discuss post 16/18 options. Students have work experience and are debriefed on the skills they have developed; work experience journals are completed and references are obtained from employers. Visit from the Police to discuss apprenticeships and roles students are not aware of.	All students use Unifrog to research career goals prior to having Careers one to one Interviews.
<b>Year 11</b>	Students are advised of Options post 16 and set goals to maximise achievement at GCSE. They are supported with all applications. They are invited to attend the National Apprenticeship show.	Students' destination data is collated to ensure every student has Options Post 16. Students who require additional support are assisted with college applications/ visits to other local providers.	Exam stress workshop delivered by a University. Final destination data is collected from the students.
<b>Sixth Form</b>	All students will have a comprehensive series of speakers from Universities and Apprenticeships about Post 18 Options. As well as wellbeing talks. Year 12 will start to prepare for Work experience Year 13 will complete their final application whether it is University, Apprenticeships or the world of work and will be totally supported.	All Students will develop their study skills using assessment periods in the Careers Centre. Year 12 will be applying for work experience Year 13 will have talks on finance, making positive contributions and preparing to leave. All Year 12 Visit to the National Apprenticeship show and the UCAS convention.	Year 12 students will use start the UCAS process starting their personal statements and researching all options. <b>Year 8/9</b>	Magistrates Mock Trial Competition Students have the opportunity to be all roles within the legal system from magistrate, lawyer, witnesses to usher. Developing analytical and communications skills and gaining confidence along the way. Competing against other schools in a real court.
<b>Year 10 to 13</b>	Bar Mock Trial Competition January (2023) As above but Judges rather than Magistrates
	Young reporter Scheme Students will meet deadlines to upload their news story onto the Newsquest website to be read by the public over an 8 month period. They then submit three stories to be judged against other Young reporters.
